Richard Smith on the other hand, lives in Stroud with his wife and two rescue cats, still scribbling verse but probably with slightly more palatable liquor. Today, it's frothy coffee at the Black Book Café, where Richard (aka Elvis) and I settle down on the squashy sofa to talk all things Stroud, stand-up and everything in-between.

The stand-up poet, comedian and broadcaster moved here during Stroud Fringe festival in 2016. "I thought, 'this is a nice party you've laid on, cheers!" he smiles, with a blink-and-you'd-miss-it hint of a Scottish accent. "It's a cracking event, and really impressive for the size of the town."

This year, he performed, and despite having read his poetry everywhere from Radio 4 and The One Show to Edinburgh Fringe and Bristol Old Vic, Richard admits he was a little apprehensive for Stroud Fringe. "It was nerve wracking because it's on your home turf, so if you get it wrong then, a) we'll have to move, b) there'll be a wicker man pyre round the back of the garden or something," he laughs.

Luckily, it was a success. Many lines have stuck in my head from that performance, particularly his ode to Stroud, with lines such as, 'We're not Johnnie Boden, we're Jonny Fluffypunk/ We wield pen and brush not polo mallet.' "The Stroud one I wrote simply because I remember looking at the map the day after the election and it was like

a sea of blue with this little splash of red and I thought, 'what's that?' 'oh it's us!' It was just a kicking off point to show why Stroud is different from the rest of the Cotswolds," says Richard.

"The main motivating factor [to move] was family, my in-laws live just down the road in Cheltenham. I'm really, really, pleased we landed on Stroud as it was a bit of a stab in the dark. But I love it, I feel quite evangelical about it, it's such a nice place."

Many of Richard's works were inspired by his former home on the Isle of Purbeck in Dorset. "I did one for The One Show, and another one about working in the pub there which was a bit of a rant about second home owners. The Isle of Purbeck is absolutely beautiful and has always had a history of second homes. But now it's got to the point where there are so many second homes and tourists that it kind of taints and strips the place of its essence. That's one of the things. that's lovely about Stroud is that people live here. There are lots of artists, writers and musicians, which is a nice thing if you're doing that, you don't feel so alone. It can be quite isolating."

Born in Perth, Richard always read poetry. He dabbled in a career in law before turning to acting. "I started writing loads of stuff around the time of the Iraq war because I was so pissed off so it was about getting it out of my system. Then I

started getting up and performing it. It was quite organic, I wasn't sat there thinking, 'right I want to be a poet.' At the time I was acting, which meant I wasn't doing much, so it was nice to write your own material, take back control."

In 2004, he won a poetry slam in Cheltenham and "just carried on doing it." "I think the word career would be too grandiose to describe what I'm doing," he laughs.

Richard's poetry is written to be performed, Elvis's thick Scottish accent and character lending itself perfectly to verses full of anarchy, satire and...whiskey. His piece 'Carry on up the Brexit' includes the now is that things have taken such a surreal turn that, for instance someone like Trump is quite hard to satirise, because what you're doing with satire is trying to take a characteristic and exaggerate and distort it to make a point, but there's nowhere really to go with him. It is strange times, really strange times."

Richard has just released an anthology of his poems, Viva Loch Lomond! Illustrated by Dorset artist Tony Kerins, the book includes 14 years' of work. "It gives me something to flog at gigs, 'cos it's not a lucrative career choice, poetry. Also it's just a nice thing, a nice record of it. It's nice to sell books

fantastic verse, 'Shoot yourself in the foot, throw dust in your eye/ Jump off a cliff, plucky Englishmen can fly/ Smack yourself in the face with a custard pie/ Brexit means Brexit.'

His poems are a satirical view of the nation through the prism of a rural idyll. He must have an awful lot of material to work with right now? "There always is lots of material," he sighs. "What's strange

in these days of digital disposable nothingness. There's something so pleasing about books, I mean look at this place," he gestures at the café's book-filled wall.

The poems cover everything from zero-hours contracts, food banks, Blair and Bush to Scottish independence, the Queen and cup cakes. I wonder if he finds the writing process cathartic? "No. There's a

lovely satisfaction when you have a eureka moment for a piece, that's lovely, you have that lightbulb moment. There's also a huge satisfaction when you've then done it, and it all fits, you've got a piece written, it's a pleasure of having created something from scratch. Hopefully the stuff is entertaining so it's lovely when you get a nice reaction from an audience, that's a buzz. But cathartic? No it probably makes me more pissed off!"

Apart from performing all over the country in no particular order -"I know, totally impractical. It's not exactly a tour is it, if it was a tour you'd sack the tour manager," he jokes - Richard has just formed a band with Dorset group Dead Plants. called Elvis and The Resurrectors. "It's great doing it with other people because you get so used to doing it on your own. It's like when I was doing the sitcom [which Richard did for Radio 4], the lovely thing about that is that it was collaborative, I wrote it with my wife Helen, you can spend an awful lot of time inside your own head otherwise."

Leicester, Winchester, Somerset, Leeds and Walsall are just a few of Richard's gig locations. Does he tailor each show? "To a degree, it's almost impossible to second guess an audience. Often you might go to a gig where you think that audience is going to be like this and it turns out completely different. Also I am aware of the fact that there will be audiences who don't agree with my politics, but you can't pull your punches, you've just got to go with it"

Next, he's writing a piece about Morrissey for the BBC, as well as commissions for birthdays, weddings and more. On December 2nd he'll be at the SVA with Jonny Fluffypunk for the local launch of Viva Loch Lomond! which promises to be a thoroughly entertaining evening. "Jonny wants to do a launching ceremony. There may be bagpipes," Richard teases.

Warm, witty, satirical, and not afraid to be plain daft, Stroud are just as pleased to welcome Richard (and Elvis) to our 'Little Metropolis' as he is to be here.

We're not honey-dipped, chocolate-box bollocks


We're not mimsy-boo-boutique more tea vicars

Rollercoaster Records

The steep wooded valleys around Stroud contain evidence of a lost world. Descend any slope and the curious explorer finds feral canals that powered the beating heart of a once thriving textile industry. This enterprise was housed in the giant stone mills that still border these watercourses. Today the mills are filled with new enterprise; tech businesses, plumbing outlets, building suppliers being the prosaic majority yet there is a surprising abundance of artists and crafts people working here too. There is also a global record label hereabouts. Rollercoaster Records is making it happening to be in Stroud and keepin' it groovy...

John Beecher was a south London lad when he first visited Stroud in the early eighties. He founded Rollercoaster as a direct result of being jilted by a local girl he was dating.

As he sat waiting for the last train home to London, another lady entered the frame.

"I thought I'd missed the train" he recalls, "then this vision came in riding a yellow bicycle and explained the train was late". Love at first sight exists. They ended up marrying- and still are married. There is a lot to be said for Stroud females it seems.

John already ran a successful record store in London but after almost a decade supplying an esoteric mix of Punk and Rock n Roll he had the itch to try something more challenging.

It was long before the global selling power of the internet existed, yet John had grown fond of Stroud and with a new romance blooming, decided this Cotswold blank canyas suited his needs.

Today Rollercoaster Records proudly calls Stroud or to be exact, the satellite village of Chalford as its head of operations.

The label is not housed in some trendy loft conversion atop a gentrified mill (which I'd expected) but is housed in a somewhat rustic former barber shop on the London Road which John bought many years ago. It is easily passed un noticed and this is a deliberate ploy. Yet it fits with John's low impact lifestyle. Rooms there are piled high with boxes and if he had a shop cat, you certainly couldn't swing it.

Rollercoaster is a specialist retro label with a global clientele. John loves old blue suede rockers like Gene Vincent, Elvis and Bill Hayley. He has a penchant for the lesser known artists of the period. He can riff genetic paths of tracks and artists as ably as John Peel.

He has a record sales side but his main business includes licensing, pressing and publishing.

Given the lack of quiet space at the HQ, John asked me to meet up in his friend's Victorian terrace house on Slad Rd. We shake hands in the front room. His friend offers us tea. John immediately apologises for only having an hour to spare me- vet we end up talking for four and a half hours. We start as the tea arrives. He senses my brief intake of breath that precedes the first "so tell me about how it all began". He fills the room with teased clips from three decades in the music industry: he reels off the names of his wars and friendships with the music industry big wigs, of duplicitous BBC executives reneging on deals, of the widows and wives of Rock stars fallen

on hard times desperate for any deal. It is as if John is actually a Rock Samaritan, happily dishing out percentages of his deals to the impoverished artists like some saint giving alms.

One anecdote stands out since it involves the parallel world of Hollywood and the movies.

Quentin Tarantino approached John to license tracks for his movies -(Pulp Fiction and a certain Link Wray tune to be precise). John recalls getting a where he realizes that the music he licensed at a heavy discount was in fact being used on a multi -million dollar big studio movie.

John is a gentle soul but he was rancored by this deception and gave Tarantino's representative both blue- language barrels (to explicit to print here).

John's fluent Anglo Saxon did the trick, for a cheque arrived some days later for double his previous license fee. He was happy but his client, then living as



call from Hollywood pitching that a low budget film needs some vintage rock and roll that Rollercoaster has on its roster. Film companies pay thousands to license music tracks and fans of Tarantino will no doubt have a well -thumbed CD of the Pulp Fiction soundtrack. For those who don't know this work then stay with me.

HILLBILLY ROCK

So John gets the call and is basically soft soaped by a very polite lady and John agrees to license the said tracks "for a song". Some months later he is having tea and watching Tarantino being interviewed in Cannes a down at heel OAP in Denmark was especially grateful for John's efforts for justice.

John is an affable, eternally calm figure. He is physically slight, nimble, with an eagerness to talk music like a teenager. He takes out his latest vinyl 45rpm release -it's Buddy Holly who beams at me with his trademark Colegate smile from the Technicolour sleeve.

Holly has been dead since 1959- when his plane crashed in a snowstorm. Yet Holly remains alive embalmed in the frontal lobes of music fans worldwide.

Holly continues giving pleasure in the 21st century in no small

part to John and Rollercoaster Records. John explains Holly and the Crickets are even directly responsible for Rollercoaster's name. For the fans reading this, it came from Everyday; "Everyday, it's a getting longer, goin' faster than a rollercoaster, love like yours" etc etc...

John is a seventy something

-a pensioner with a head of long,
bouncy grey hair tied in a pony
tail that merges into a waterfall
beard and moustache worthy of a
Tolkien wizard.

He has a ready smile and a manner devoid of ego. He is arguably a surviving Hippy- but that would be a slight. John is very focused and an astute dealmaker. He still has desire and ambitions. He gets animated about a new project with upcoming local Stroud band the Red Propellers (see page 10!). He pressed their new release.

As we leave, he is soon in full swing pitching me about a long lost film script written about Buddy Holly that he wants to acquire from 20th Century Fox. The clock strikes five pmhomeward bound traffic shakes the windows of the terraced house and reminds me we are in Stroud on a dark autumnal night and not on Hollywood Boulevard.

I am impressed by his knowledge and passion but It is time for John to go back to work. LA is waking up. The internet never sleeps.

I am presented with some Rollercoaster vinyl to take and play and John gives me the link to his extensive catalogue of retro rock. He pulls on a jaunty embroidered round cap worthy of a Rock Legend- more folksy Dylan-esque rather than Brian Johnson-esque and skips away into the night.

A postscript; there is a very important fact he wants me to include in this potted history. John is a world authority on the music and life of Buddy Holly and the Crickets and was the proud head of Holly's UK fan club. Now you know where to go, right? Rave on.

The Red Propellers - an edgy post punk 4 piece fronted by long term Stroud resident James Dick - are famed for their live performances, a full throttled aural attack with incisive poetic vocals, pounding drums and crunching guitars, an abrasive sound truly reminiscent of the best music coming out of No Wave era (mid to late 1970's) New York. I spoke with James prior to their performance at The Betsey Trotwood in London where they were promoting the release of their latest 7 inch single.

James, well done to you and the band for securing a gig at this prestigious venue - how did it come about?

Stroud Riff Raff Poet Jeff Cloves, an early fan of the Red Propellers, introduced us to Nigel Cross of Shagrat Records. He took an immediate liking to the band and suggested that the band be introduced to London with a gig at the renowned venue Betsev Trotwood to publicize the launch of our new vinvl single Sandi savs / Johnny. Johnny. So. in a relatively short time, through his contacts, one thing after another has happened: the gig, radio airplay and a Shindig magazine review. He seems to understand the music and wants to help the band garner a larger audience. We are extremely grateful.

You mentioned radio airplay....?

Nigel sent our No Reprieve ep to DJ Howard Thompson in New York. He was responsible for furthering the career of the band Suicide in Europe in the 1970's. He played Sandi were all listening to it live. It was quite the thrill when it came on. The gracious soundbite afterwards even more so. He wrote to say usually people only make contact after a show to complain but that he had an unprecedented positive response

For Good on Paper readers who are unfamiliar with the band could you give a brief history and tell us about vour connections with Stroud?

The Red Propellers have been together 5 years now. James Nash our powerhouse drummer and I are original members. Guitarist extraordinaire. David 'Mac' McEvov ioined us three years ago and helped us come into our own as a live band. Harry Parkin our bassist has been with us for a year and has strengthened and diversified our song writing. He also came up with the beautiful riff on 'As Rumours Abound' that ends the No Reprieve

We have always identified as a Bristol band rehearsing out of Factory Studios but the band's

infrastructure is Stroud based. Mac and I are residents, our label Rollercoaster Records is based in Chalford, we record at DB Studios on Folley Lane with engineering wizard Andrew Butler, Imogen Shaw of Qwertytop in Slad does our graphics. Wheatley's Printers in Thrupp the printing and packaging and our film maker Alasdair Ogilvie lives in

I once heard you describe your vocals as "talking in tune" and I've seen you perform solo poetry readings delivered with the same energy as when you front the band. Which poets and writers are you

I heard Tom Verlaine of Television describe his vocals as 'talking in tune'. Seemed apt! Someone recently described my vocals as semi-sung, which I quite like as well. I was fortunate to latch on to Patti Smith early on and have been inspired by how she managed to transfer her poetry to song lyrics. Same with Jim Carroll Lam a long time Bob Dylan fan, Jack Kerouac's poems in Scattered Poems, especially the western haikus have helped me in writing concise images. Vic Chesnutt from Athens, Georgia has also been a huge influence, especially in reflection on being from the American south and using my accent for rhyming and intonation.

You seem to enjoy playing with the words - lots of repetition and rhythmic inflections - do you have an interest in Jazz?

I listen to discordant jazz. Albert Ayler, Eric Dolphy and the like. Cat scaring music. An extension of my fondness for distorted guitar

How do you write the songs? Words first or music first, does the band write collectively?

It varies Sometimes I will come to rehearsal with a set of lyrics and a tempo in mind or a song to reference. Mostly though, Mac or Harry will just start riffing and we all ioin in. The structure of the song that comes out of the improvisation is pretty much always determined by the lyrics and the limitations of my voice and timing.

Your latest release is on your own label longblackcoat, please tell us about it? What is your relationship with Stroud based label Rollercoaster Records?

John Beecher of Rollercoaster Records was one of the first people I met when moving to Stroud, I used to buy rockabilly cassettes from him and we have been close friends for the last ten years or so. There would be no Red Propeller product if not for John's generosity and support! We created longblackcoat Records together as a subsidiary of Rollercoaster Records solely for The Red Propellers. Link Wray and The Red Propellers both on Rollercoaster Records. Kind of cool.

What are your future plans?

To continue playing live and recording. In March next year, we have been invited to play live on Resonance Radio in London, and an instore gig at Rough Trade East is also coming up. Interesting one off gigs are what we prefer.

The Red Propellers two EP's (Images released in 2016 and this year's No Reprieve) and the new double A-side 7 inch single Sandi Savs/Johnny. Johnny are available now via rollercoasterrecords.com, Trading Post record shop in Stroud and on amazon. Follow the band at facebook.com/TheRedPropellers for news and updates.

Sean Roe is based in Stroud and runs the invisible record shop JunKroom Records. He is also an artist and musician and member of synth post-punk duo Junk Props.

Walking, poetry and word-play are the inspiration for Lucy's letterpress prints. Letterpress is sometimes combined with lino or relief print. She is a member of Stroud-based artists' group 'Walking the Land' (walkingtheland.org.uk) and uses drawings and notes made on walks as a basis for prints. Her mantra is solvitur ambulando (maxim attributed to St. Jerome) which translates as: it is solved by walking.

Lucy is a full-time member of the Gloucestershire Printmaking Cooperative (gpchq.co.uk) at Griffin Mill in Stroud where she runs letterpress courses. She studied Graphic Design (BA) at Saint Martin's School of Art, completed an MA in Multi-Disciplinary Printmaking at UWF in 2015 and works as a freelance book designer.



If anyone deserves a lifetime achievement award in film, it should be the organisers of the Stroud Film Society - Tim and Kirsten Mugford, who have been an integral part of the society since it was

Tim Mugford came to Stroud in 1958 and joined the Stroud Film Society, then in its first year, straight away. Kirsten joined soon after that. Tim became the society's chairman in 1978. The society had no funding when it began, just the enthusiasm of its co-founders Jack and Grace Allington who had started the Camelot Film Club, which they then affiliated to the BFI to become a film society. Membership was by subscription and guest tickets were 1/6d (one shilling and sixpence for those who don't remember, that's about 8p). Their first film was Oh Mr Porter (dir. Marcel Varnel, 1937) starring Will Hav: then there was

founded sixty years ago.

Stroud's own Animal Farm. Animal Farm was made in Stroud by John Halas and Joy Batchelor, and it was Stroud Film Society that organised the plaque to the Halas and Batchelor Studios in Eblev. The society hosted a Halas and Batchelor evening in conjunction with the Stroud Film Festival back in March this year. Presented by their daughter Vivien Halas, the event showcased H&B animation shorts and Animal Farm to a full house. There was also an exhibition of their work in Stroud Museum.

It was John Halas who presented the society with their first award in 1970, when they were joint winner of Film Society of the Year, which won them a cinemascope screen. Sixty years ago showing a film

was a bit of an effort. The society had two 16mm projectors that had to be raised up to the projection room on pulleys. The film reels were then put on (in order) bulbs changed and films projected. Never once did their film burn through like it always does in the movies! In the Seventies, power cuts threatened to disrupt the program, but. undaunted, Jack Allington set up a generator - the show must go on!

Films have been couriered through the rain, one arrived just on time and one did not arrive at all. There were screens 1 and 2, standing room only and waiting lists. All this led to the Stroud Film Society winning again in 1980 and this time they received six free films. The "great and the good" says Tim Mugford, were so impressed by the win, that the society was described as an "oasis in the desert of Stroud culture"! Even the citation from the BFI mentioned "poor public transport" and a meeting place which "was not very central" and yet, "the

society has been able to maintain a membership waiting list for twenty successive seasons - surely a triumphant success story." In that year they ran The China Syndrome, The Last Wave, and Kramer vs Kramer. Kirsten still recalls the popularity of Kramer vs Kramer, the event was packed. Other highlights for Kirsten include A Matter of Life and Death (dir. Michael Powell also a Stroud district man) and The Third Man. One of the best moments for Tim. was the visit, in 1982, by Mike Hodges, the director of the iconic and gritty Seventies gangster film, Get Carter, who gave a talk using excerpts from his ongoing projects.

To get technical for a moment.

Stroud Film Society in 1982 with Mike Hodges, the director of Get Carter

a film society is different from a film club in that film societies are affiliated to the British Film Institute and each has a space on the BFI Neighbourhood Cinema website. There are regular selection viewings and an annual awards ceremony that encourages societies to keep going even when there is poor public transport! Members of the committee attend viewings to select films. They vote on those films through a card system that feeds back comments to the distributors. The audience in Stroud votes on the films using brass discs, rating them from "Excellent" to "Poor". The selection process is rigorous to harsh (the most recent viewing programme from Tim includes scribbled comments on it such as "Rubbish!") "The ones that we suggest we choose to show

would be films we would like to see

again" says Kirsten and she highly recommends the animation My Life as a Courgette that will be shown together with the Eagle Huntress on 22nd February 2018 at Open House Community Hall (AKA the British School).

Membership is lower than it used to be, television, 3D and Netflix are all a factor, the 16mm projectors are packed away and Blu Ray is the preferred projection method. Membership is still by subscription, quest tickets cost slightly more than 1/6d but £40 a year for 11 films this season is an excellent deal. The BFI has renamed the film societies' umbrella organisation Cinema For All and its next award ceremony is this month, so here's to many more awards for Stroud and District Film Society, it truly is a lifetime's

The next film in the Society's current programme is Taiki Waititi's Hunt for the Wilder People which will be screened at the Open House Hall (opposite Star Anise Arts Café) on Thursday 14th December. 
